City Adopts Tobacco Sales and No Smoking Ordinance

In response to residents' requests for stronger regulations limiting tobacco sales to youth and eliminating smoking from public open spaces in our City, the San Gabriel City Council adopted a new ordinance amending the Municipal Code.

On March 2, the Council adopted ordinance No. 585-C.S. amending the Municipal Code by requiring all retailers who sell tobacco and related products to obtain a tobacco retailer's license by July 1.

Additionally, the Code is amended to prohibit smoking and the use of tobacco products in all City parks, including adjacent sidewalks and parking lots. This restriction on smoking in parks and recreation areas was effective as of April 1. In May, the City will communicate to the business community, the information necessary for obtaining a tobacco retailer's license by July 1.



Historic Welcome Signs Being Restored

San Gabriel's historic, neon-illuminated welcome signs have received a new lease on life as part of a package of new investments in San Gabriel's infrastructure.

The San Gabriel City Council voted 5-0 to commence restoration and engage a maintenance contract for the five historic 'gateway' signs on Las Tunas Drive, San Gabriel Boulevard and Valley Boulevard.

The Council's approval also includes funds to restore the historic San Gabriel Village sign at Del Mar Avenue and Fairview Avenue, which will then be enhanced with foundation plantings. The project, conducted under direction of the Public Works Department, is part of a package of public works initiatives that includes installation of new aerial street signs (now complete); new pole-mounted street signs (installation to begin this month); and street tree plantings this spring to complete the Las Tunas Drive corridor.

Caltrans I-10 Project Now Underway

A Caltrans construction project on the San Bernardino Freeway (I-10) between downtown Los Angeles and the San Gabriel River Freeway (I-605) now underway will eventually restore east- and west-bound lanes and ramps. This portion of I-10 was first opened to traffic in 1956, and has seen heavy use by commuters and large commercial vehicles. As a major thoroughfare, it serves numerous eastern suburbs within Los Angeles County, as well as communities in San Bernardino and Riverside counties.

The restoration of I-10 includes replacement of damaged slabs, widening shoulders, and ramp realignment. Construction requires lane and ramp closures for night work; such closures are not permitted during morning and afternoon peak traffic hours.

In San Gabriel, a continuous long term closure of the east bound Del Mar Avenue off ramp is scheduled to begin this month. It's estimated that the ramps will be closed between 30-42 days. When a closure date is established, information will be provided in news releases and posted on the project webpage (<http://dot.ca.gov/dist07/travel/projects/details.php?id=44>).

Upon project completion, estimated for Spring 2011, motorists will have a smoother, safer drive. Roadbed restoration will reduce time required for maintenance and minimize the need for lane closures.

Pedestrian Safety Is Everyone's Business

“Pedestrian struck and killed on roadway by passing motorist,” said police. Those are words we hate to hear on the radio or read in our local newspaper. Sadly, these accidents almost always leave pedestrians severely or fatally injured. However, many of these accidents can be avoided through preventative measures, which start with you – motorists and pedestrians alike.

While it is easy to blame drivers, they are not always responsible. All too often, pedestrians are the cause of accidents. At times, pedestrians are unaware of their surroundings, cross the street without regard to oncoming traffic, jaywalk or dart out mid-block in front of a vehicle.

Pedestrians can help prevent accidents and protect themselves by obeying the rules of the road; walking defensively; being vigilant and aware of their surroundings; stopping at the curb or corner and looking left-right-left before proceeding to cross a street while checking for vehicles; crossing streets at intersections and looking for signs or signals that help pedestrians cross safely and not assuming you are completely safe or have the right-of-way in marked crosswalks.

Despite the many reasons for pedestrian caused accidents, the greatest contributing factor is driver negligence. Drivers have to take responsibility to exercise caution on roads as well as in parking lots, sidewalks, and around schools. Drivers who disregard a crosswalk, a pedestrian crossing the road, traffic control devices; speed, talk on cell phones, or drive while intoxicated, are acting recklessly and without regard for the safety of others.

Defensive driving is imperative, and drivers must always be cautious and alert to their surroundings. So, slow down, pay attention to signs and crosswalks, do not be distracted, use caution when driving near a school or park, and most of all, obey the rules of the road.

The event will be held at the City Yard, 121 W. Mission Rd. on May 20, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.



Neighborhood Watch Program Helps Deter Crime

Don't let criminals knock your block off! At the San Gabriel Police Department, one of our goals is to have more citizens join the Neighborhood Watch program and become more involved with our community," states Chief David A. Lawton.

"By you and your neighbors coming together and joining the Neighborhood Watch program, you support each other in an effort to deter crime in your neighborhood," added Chief Lawton. "The Neighborhood Watch program involves residents developing an increased awareness of suspicious activity in their neighborhood and becoming the eyes and ears of law enforcement."

Your role as a member is simply to observe what is going on in your neighborhood, and when someone or something does not look right, to call the police. In order for you to know what is suspicious, you must know your neighbors, their children, the vehicles they drive, and other everyday activities that occur in your neighborhood. That is what makes Neighborhood Watch an effective tool against crime.
